Dental hygienists provide preventive dental services, serve as advocates for the public, and apply research methods to improve community health.


Since its inception, the school has educated the majority of dental hygienists practicing in New Mexico.

The Department of Dental Medicine continues to develop interprofessional collaborations with other UNM School of Medicine departments. The dental hygiene students learn with dental medicine residents in a variety of UNM clinics.

Dental hygiene students are taught how to practice in a variety of areas and importantly how to transform dental hygiene so that all populations receive the benefits of dental hygiene care.

Members of our faculty have published multiple books used by dental hygiene programs across the country.

CURRICULUM

The Dental Hygiene program at UNM's School of Medicine is a five-semester (2.5 year) curriculum. The program admits a cohort of 24 students each year in the Spring semester. Student selection is based on GPA, state residency, shadowing experience, and a personal interview.

Once admitted, students pursue both didactic coursework in oral pathology, dental health education, radiology, dental bio materials, dental anatomy, head and neck anatomy, oral histology and embryology, pharmacology, periodontology, dental public health, local anesthesia, and pain control.

Additionally, they spend two semesters developing their clinical skills and contributing to community health in Novitski Hall's dental hygiene facility.

Upon graduation from the dental hygiene program, students take clinical and written national board exams. Students must successfully complete these examinations to receive state licensure and the title of Registered Dental Hygienist (RDH).
