CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

The 31st Annual Amazing Newborns Conference, titled **Averting Crisis in the Newborn**, is aimed at providing health care professionals tools and skills to assess the newborn who is in crisis at birth. Included in this year's conference are 2-30 minute "Treat Now!" talks, aimed at giving providers information on how to identify and treat conditions that require immediate care to prevent long-term complications. The breakout session will focus on skills needed for assessment and stabilization.

CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this conference, the participant should be able to:

- 1. Identify neonates at greater risk for poor neurodevelopmental outcomes based on maternal opioid use.
- 2. Apply current modalities for the treatment of PPHN to improve recovery and decrease the negative long-term effects of hypoxia in the neonate.
- 3. Assess the resources, knowledge and skills they currently have when treating at-risk populations to identify areas in need to support and improve.
