1. CALL TO ORDER AND CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

Dr. McGrew called the meeting to order at 2:03 PM

2. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA (action item)

Mr. Houston moved to accept the agenda as presented. Chief Johnson **SECONDED.** All were in favor. Motion **CARRIED.**

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES (action item)

Chief Johnson moved to approve the June 23, 2020 General Meeting Minutes. Mr. Houston **SECONDED.** All were in favor. Motion **CARRIED.**

4. ELECTION OF BOARD OFFICERS: (action item)

Dr. McGrew asked for a nomination of the OMI Board Chair. Chief Johnson nominated the Acting Health Secretary, Dr. Collins as Board Chair, Mr. Houston as the Vice Chair and Dr. McGrew as the Board Secretary. Dr. McGrew asked the nominees if they agree to serve in those roles. Mr. Houston agreed. Dr. Collins declined the nomination of Board Chair. Dr. McGrew made mention that Sec. Trujillo was not present therefore the board may table the action item to the next board meeting.

Dr. McGrew asked for a motion to table the election of board officers to the next board meeting. Mr. Houston **MOVED.** Chief Johnson **SECONDED.** All were in favor. Motion **CARRIED.**

Dr. McGrew introduced the new Executive Vice President of UNM Health Sciences Center and CEO of UNM Health, Dr. Douglas Ziedonis. Dr. Ziedonis thanked Dr. McGrew for the Introduction.

5. **UPDATE OF OMI CHIEF SEARCH:**

Dr. Sigl, chair of the search committee for the OMI chief search updated the board. This is the seconded search for the OMI Chief Medical Investigator. There were three applicants in this search. One did not meet the minimum requirements. The search committee interviewed both applicants and unanimously recommended that one of the applicants be put forward as a candidate for seconded interviews. That applicant is the current OMI Interim Chief Medical Investigator, Dr. Heather Jarrell. Seconded Interviews are ongoing. At completion of the process, Dr. McGrew will make a recommendation to the hiring agent which is the OMI Board.

Dr. McGrew announced to consider a special meeting of the board in early January 2021, to move forward with selecting a new OMI chief and revisit the election of OMI board officers. The search committee members are as followed:

6. REPORT FROM THE INTERIM CHIEF MEDICAL INVESTIGATOR:

Dr. Jarrell reported to the board that the OMI received National Association of Medical Examiners (NAME) accreditation. Dr. Jarrell introduced new OMI Forensic Pathologist Dr. Clarissa Krinsky.

Dr. Jarrell presented a slide that highlighted a funding request- Research and Public Service Project (RPSP) she presented to the Legislative Health and Humans Services Committee (LHHS) on October 27, 2020. The OMI was issued a 6% cut for FY22. The slide reflects the request for the 6% back for a total RPSP request of \$537,950

 - Total Request \$37,950 (Salary + Fringe)


2. Decedent Transportation: \$165,108

- Annual decedent transportation cost is \$1.1 to \$1.2 million
- Large expenditure to total operating budget

3. NMS Toxicology: \$67,500

 Non-pending toxicology projected expense for FY22 is approximately \$250,000

Dr. Jarrell presented slides illustrating COVID-19 Postmortem Testing. Late November, the OMI had to change the case triage approach to COVID-19, for decedents with reported symptoms who died unattended deaths. Decedents with significant comorbities present on CT and/or provided medical history that could otherwise account for death, will be evaluated with an external exam, CT, and nasopharyngeal swab due to overwhelming volume of cases.







The red line indicates the OMI decedent storage for 2020.

- OMI must issue cremation permits to authorize cremation, which is a checkpoint to ensure that a decedent who falls under OMI isn't cremated prior to OMI examination
- Average about 80 cremation permits per day
- Indigent burials/cremations being processed, but the process is slowing down in the pandemic due to outside agency capacity to house

7. **DEATH CERTIFICATES:**

Dr. Jarrell reports that the next agenda item is to provide situational awareness to the OMI board. The OMI currently has five cases where additional information and/or circumstances have been brought forward and the manner of death needs to be amended. This state statute has caused families to have to wait longer to receive the amended death certificate. Dr. Jarrell has reached out to NMDOH BVS and University Counsel, Scot Sauder to try and work out a solution.



7.2.2.17 AMENDMENT OF LIVE BIRTH AND DEATH CERTIFICATES:

G. Amendment of the same item more than once. Once an amendment of an item is made on a vital record, that item shall not be amended again except upon receipt of a certified court order.

Mr. Sauder informed the board that he will suggest to NMDOH to publish an amendment to this regulation to except the OMI from this rule.

8. **BUDGET UPDATE:**

Dr. Jarrell presented a slide to the board and gave an update about the OMI budget.

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Dr. Jarrell mentioned in her budget report that the OMI does receive some reimbursement from FEMA for COVID-19 related expenses.

Chief Johnson asked if the OMI includes body transportation expenses that are COVID-19 related in the reimbursements submitted to FEMA. Dr. Jarrell replied that this is a good idea to consider and she will take this recommendation and review with OMI accounting.

Dr. McGrew inquired of the 4 vacant forensic pathologist positions, are salary savings form those vacancies applied to the OMI budget. Dr. Jarrell replied that the salary savings go to locums and

faculty extra compensation base on the additional workload. Dr. McGrew thanked Dr. Jarrell and the OMI for everything they have done in the last year.

Mr. Luis Terrazas of Terrazas Funeral Chapels joined the meeting late and commented that he appreciates all that OMI does and is mindful of their budget shortfall. He has reached out to OMI leadership, the Legislative Finance Committee and Lieutenant Governor Howie Morales regarding OMI's budget cuts. Mr. Terrazas further spoke to the board about the cremation permit and indigent process with OMI and funeral home industry.
